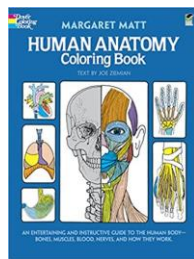
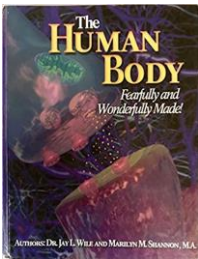

Class Description: In this class, Students will learn the basic anatomy and physiology in each of the 11 body systems from a biblical creationist viewpoint. We will examine the body's organs and structures that give sure evidence for God's existence and His unique design. Just the engineering marvel of the human foot and the eye's 10 billion calculations per second alone, testify that we are fearfully and wonderfully made! I will challenge your Students with in-depth questions and we will focus on the interwoven complexity between the body systems.

Recognizing the body's different systems will be reinforced by coloring-in the different sections of the body in the coloring book, which is used by university students as an effective study aid.

Students will be challenged to think through the evidence - the facts as we know them today - and to consider the statistical likelihood of macroevolution. The end-result is an effective, interwoven presentation of anatomy, physiology, and creation. A field trip may be included in this class.

Daily Homework is Expected: including papers, research, and at least one project per semester.
